1. WARM-UP – “What do you like?”

Write these activities on the board:

- playing soccer
- watching movies
- listening to music
- reading books
- playing video games
- dancing
- swimming
- riding a bike
- drawing
- cooking

Students stand up and move around the classroom.

They must ask **3 classmates**:

Do you like playing soccer?

The classmate answers:

Yes, I do. / No, I don't.

Then ask:

- **What do you like doing in your free time?**
- **What sport do you like playing?**
- **What do you like watching?**

3. GRAMMAR – Likes + Gerunds

Explain:

When we use **like, love, enjoy, dislike and hate** to talk about activities, we usually use the **-ing form**.

Structure:

Subject + like/love/enjoy/dislike/hate + verb-ing

Examples:

I like **playing** soccer.
She loves **dancing**.
We enjoy **watching** movies.
He dislikes **running**.
They hate **studying** on weekends.

Important

After these expressions, use **verb + ING**.

✗ I like play soccer.
✓ I like playing soccer.

✗ She loves dance.
✓ She loves dancing.

because + reason

I love swimming because it is fun.

I hate running because it is difficult.
